




Types of household noise complained about

Call for evidence – key findings

- ▶ Received 374 responses
 - 265 from residents
 - 87 from landlords
 - 22 from environmental health specialists.
- ▶ 42% of the residents live in low-rise flats (four stories or less)
- ▶ 25% of the residents reported the age of their property as being 40 to 60 years old
- ▶ 206 resident respondents had reported at least one noise issue to their landlord – just over a third were about household noise
- ▶ The majority of landlords (66 of 87 respondents) confirmed that most noise reports made to them are about household noise
- ▶ only six of the 22 EH specialists felt that the most common noise reported was household noise

Recommendations for Landlords

- ▶ 32 recommendations in total
- ▶ 12 themes including:
 - Void standard
 - Policies
 - Allocations
 - Data, record keeping and information sharing
 - Respect
 - Starting the tenancy
 - Existing tenancies
 - Handling a noise report
